

## **CARES Act FINAL Quarterly Report October -December 2020**

**Yeshivat Hechal Shemuel has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. Yeshivat Hechal Shemuel will receive or has received a total of \$45,602 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.**

**Yeshivat Hechal Shemuel has disbursed \$87,203 to 39 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of December 10, 2020. \$45,602 of this amount was from Section 18004(a)(1) student portion. \$41,601 of this amount was from Section 18004(a)(1) institutional portion. The institution provided an additional \$7,698 of institutional funds for emergency financial aid grants to students.**

**The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act who are currently enrolled for the Fall 2020 semester is 39.**

**The method used by Yeshivat Hechal Shemuel to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive is based on the total grant allocation and expenses for food, course material, equipment needed to participate in the educational program due to the disruption of campus operations, travel home expenses and health care related expenses which has been calculated at \$100 for a dependent student and \$500 - \$5900 for an independent student.**

**Students received the following instructions with their grants: "As per the CARES Act, these grants are to be used for expenses that are related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, including things like course materials and technology as well as food, housing, health care, and childcare."**
